# The California Public-Safety Radio Association, Inc.

The California Public-Safety Radio Association (hereinafter referred to as CPRA) was originally founded in 1935 as a statewide group called the California Police Radio Association. Because California is so large, it was decided in 1941 to divide the state between North and South. A line was drawn from east to west through Fresno. The group to the north of Fresno was known as the Northern California Police Communication Officers. This group is now known as the Northern California Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials or NAPCO. The area south of Fresno was at first known as the California Police Communication Officers but shortly afterward the Southern California group changed the name back to the original California Police Radio Association (CPRA). On April 1, 1945, CPRA became a chartered chapter of the then Associated Police Communications Officers (APCO). In 1953 the CPRA Chapter, in order to better reflect its membership, changed its name to the California Public-Safety Radio Association. In 1956, the Association followed suit and changed its name to the Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials (hereinafter referred to as APCO). Since it was a separate organization when it joined APCO in 1945, the name CPRA was allowed to be grandfathered. All other present and future chapters are now required to use APCO in their chapter names.

Today, the Southern California Chapter (CPRA Chapter) of APCO is made up of over 600 local volunteer public safety professionals from Police, Fire, EMS, 9-1-1, State/Local Government, Tribal, Military, Forestry, Highway and Conservation services who volunteer their time and expertise for the betterment of public safety communications. It represents more than 250 Public Safety agencies and 9-1-1 Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs) who serve over 23 million people throughout Southern California. Our Corporate members, who provide products or services to public safety, also support and participate in many of the activities of the Chapter. The Southern California Chapter of APCO meets monthly in various Southern California locations.

The Southern California Chapter of APCO is an all-volunteer 501(c)(3) non-profit charitable organization which provides its members with Operational and Technical education and training, discusses the current critical issues affecting Public Safety and 9-1-1 PSAPs, disseminates the latest information on emerging technologies including Next Gen 9-1-1 and FirstNet, reports on FCC Regulatory notices and actions, conducts monthly Frequency Coordination meetings, advises on the current activities at APCO International, and provides an opportunity for networking with peers. Additionally, the Chapter holds special events throughout the year, including: an Annual Public Safety Awards Banquet in April that recognizes the top 9-1-1 Practitioners & Technologists in Southern California; an Annual Vendor Showcase & Training event in October that displays the latest equipment and services for Public Safety; and an Officer Installation Dinner & Holiday Celebration in December. The Southern California Chapter also publishes a monthly Chapter member newsletter, called "The CommLink", which is available on the Chapter website.

This year we continued our long-standing tradition of hosting monthly meetings and frequency coordination for our members and the public.

In April we held our largest event of the year at the Knott's Berry Farm Hotel, celebrating National Telecommunicators Week. The Annual Public Safety Awards Banquet was well attended by over 300 911 Professionals and Technologists. 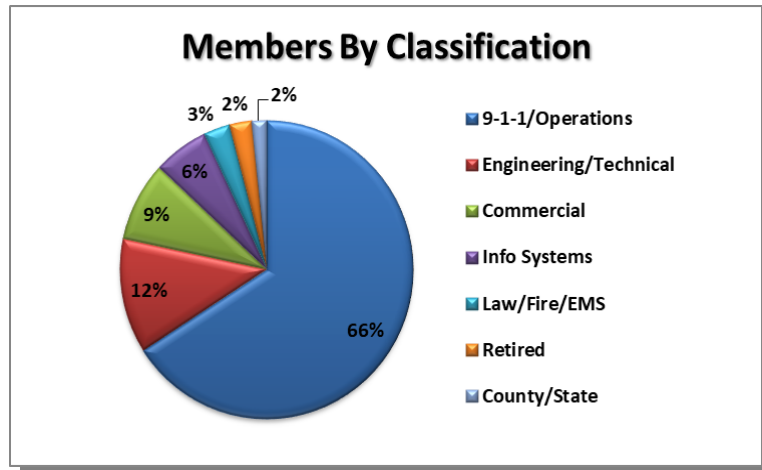

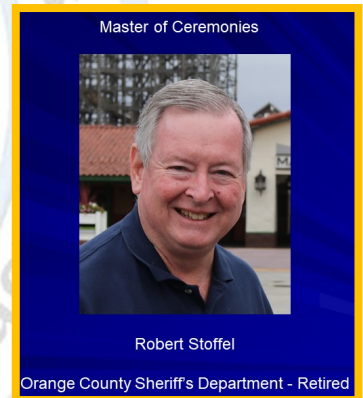

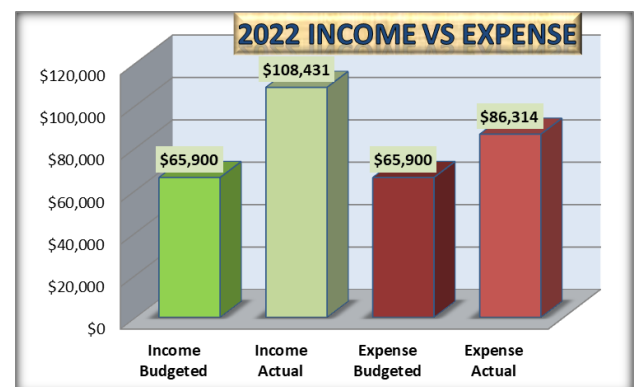

Credit Card processing for payments to the chapter is provided through Union Bank and Square. All Square credit card transactions are direct deposited into the Chapter's Non-Profit Checking Account. Additionally, the Chapter utilizes Venmo to accept payments to the Chapter (Venmo Account: SoCal APCO@APCO-International). All Venmo transactions are direct deposited into the Chapter's Non-Profit Checking Account. Other than for issuing electronic refunds for payments already received by the Chapter, no outgoing payments are allowed utilizing Square, Venmo, Cash Cards, Gift Cards, or Bank Transfer.

**Payments:** All outgoing payments are limited to Chapter Check, Chapter Credit Card, or Petty Cash only.

**APCO Dues:** Association dues designated for the CPRA Chapter are direct deposited monthly from APCO International into the Chapter's Non-Profit Checking Account. CPRA is an APCO Tier II dues chapter.

**Assets:** Per Chapter Financial Policy, equipment valued at \$500 or greater is determined to be an "Asset" of the Chapter and therefore reportable to the IRS. Equipment value is depreciated annually at the current IRS published depreciation schedule.
